SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION:

On 3-7-00 between 0540 hours and 0600 hours Detective Don Newcomer #4599 was conducting follow-up on a sexual assault investigation in the area of Cave Creek Rd and Beardsley Rd. He was in his city assigned vehicle (equipment #510047) and was south bound on Cave Creek Rd. when he struck a temporary traffic barricade. The resulting impact knocked the driver's side exterior mirror out. Detective Newcomer #4599 telephoned me and advised that the side view mirror on his police vehicle had been damaged at the Circle K, 2359 E Beardsley Rd., by an unknown vehicle while he was inside conducting follow-up. Detective Newcomer then completed a memorandum indicating the same and had photographs taken of the damage.

On 3-9-00 in the AM hours Detective Newcomer spoke to me in my office and advised that the damage to his vehicle had in fact not been caused by an unknown vehicle hitting it as previously reported. Detective Newcomer handed me a second memorandum that stated he had caused the damage to the vehicle by striking a traffic barricade in the area previously described.
